
## SERMON NOTES

21st May 2023 | A Prayer for the Ephesians | Ephesians 3:14-21



## Questions for reflection:

- 1. Paul begins in verse 14 by saying, 'For this reason...' What do you think that reason is?
- 2. How is God characterised in vs.14 & 15?
- 3. What are the specific things that Paul prays for the Ephesians?
- 4. What are the 'glorious riches' (vs.16) that Paul has in mind?
- 5. What does Paul pray for the Ephesians to be rooted and established in? Why is this important?
- 6. What are some examples of the height, depth, length and width of God's love for us (see Psalm 103:11-12, Micah 7:19, Jeremiah 31:3)
- 7. In what way are we 'filled to the measure of all the fullness of God'?
- 8. How is God glorified through the church (vs.21)?



## Questions for reflection:

- 1. What does it mean for Christ to dwell in our hearts and for the Holy Spirit to strengthen us? How can we strengthen ourselves in the Lord?
- 2. How do the following things feature in Paul's prayer: strength, love, faith, understanding, knowledge, God the Father, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit?
- 3. Why does Paul ask that Christ may dwell in the hearts of the Ephesians? What difference would this have made in their everyday living?
- 4. What images does 'rooted and established in' bring to mind?
- 5. God is described as 'able to do immeasurably more that all we can ask or imagine'. How does this truth impact your life and prayers?



## Questions for reflection:

- 1. How can you live for the glory of God the Father today?
- 2. Take time to meditate on these verses with a particular focus on the love of God for you. How should you live knowing you are so extravagantly loved?
- 3. God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine. How can this truth encourage you to pray big prayers today?
