Questions for reflection:

- 1. Why does Joshua call the leaders together? What was the basic content of his message to them?
- 2. What reminders does Joshua give them? What does this teach us about Joshua's leadership?
- 3. The phrase 'Lord your God' appears 12 times in this chapter. What is the significance of this repetition for the people?
- 4. Joshua tell the people to 'be very strong and careful' (vs.6) and to 'be very careful to love the Lord your God' (vs.11). Do you think there is a connection between obeying and love for God?
- 5. What are the warnings should they turn away from God (vs.12-14)? Does the New Testament offer similar warnings to us today?
- 6. What is the contrast between vs.14 and vs.15? Why is it important to understand that our good Father is the author of both?



Questions for reflection:

- Stu suggested that every decision we make adds to the story we get tell of ourselves - do you agree? What major decisions have you made which have impacted your story?
- 2. One author wrote, 'Private decisions have public impact' would you agree?
- 3. Do you think it is a sin to forget the things that God has done in our past?
- 4. Why is it important to remember all that God has done?
- 5. Stu suggested that vs.6-11 outline practical things we can do to make sure we do not forget the good things God has done. What are they?
- 6. What are the biggest cultural influences that are infiltrating the church today? How can Christians stand fast and mould culture rather than being moulded by culture?



Questions for reflection:

- 1. What big decisions are before me now, which will impact my story?
- 2. Make a list of ways in which God has revealed His goodness to you this year (take your time). Spend time praising God for His goodness.
- 3. Tell one person this week about the difference knowing Jesus has made to your story.
