Questions for reflection:

- 1. Explore 2 Samuel 22:1-4. What characters of God are highlighted here?
- 2. David describes (figuratively) how God showed up for him in 2 Samuel 22:8-16. What does this tell us about God and what he can do on behalf of His people??
- 3. Compare 2 Samuel 22:5-7 and 2 Corinthians 1:8-11. Why would appear as if God abandons us at some difficult times?
- 4. What might 'deep waters' mean for us today (2 Samuel 22:17-19)? What can we learn from David on what to do when we find ourselves in deep waters?
- 5. In 2 Samuel 22:21-26, David appears to say that God delivered him because of his uprightness. Would you agree with this? Why does God show-up for us in times of trouble?
- 6. David praised God because He delivered him (2 Samuel 22:47-51). When should we praise God?



Questions for reflection:

- 1. What is your default response when you find yourself in distress?
- 2. What is it about the character of God that encourages us in these moments?
- 3. Why do you think God allows our faith to be stretched to almost breaking point? Have you experienced this before? What was God teaching / shaping in you during this time?
- 4. How does a discipline of prayer sustain us when we are in distress?
- 5. What passages can we turn to, to help us praise God when we are in distress?



Questions for reflection:

- 1. How can you express your trust and faith in God's faithfulness today?
- 2. Use 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 as a prayer for yourself today?
- 3. Joel used the phrase 'You are now entering the mission field' as an encouragement when leaving church. How can you live out the message of 2 Samuel 22 on your frontline today?
